

# Certified Pinzgauer Beef

Why not make Certified  
Pinzgauer Beef.





The APA now has a Certified Pinzgauer Beef program available to all Pinzgauer breeders. In order to comply with USDA requirements, all breeders using the Certified Pinzgauer Beef label must complete the following steps below:

1. The affidavit of compliance is available on the APA Web site.
2. The breeder completes the affidavit and returns it to the APA with the \$100 fee.
3. The APA office sends the packet of forms to the breeder.
4. The breeder completes the form and sends the original and 2 copies to the USDA. The breeder must complete Box 4, which is the Establishment number of the butcher that is being used to process their beef.
5. Upon approval, the USDA will send one set of approved forms back to the breeder.
6. The breeder takes the forms to the butcher shop and makes arrangements with them for label printing.



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
